The bidding in pairs events is usually very aggressive but the same contract is often reached at several tables. Here is a hand where there were very few identical scores.

BIDDING: After West bid 1S, North made a takeout double. South jumped to 3H to show 9-11 points and that ended the auction. He chose hearts rather than clubs because the scoring favors the major suits.

PLAY: Poor South never had a chance. West led his singleton ace of clubs and East, seeing the king in dummy, suspected it was a short-suit lead and followed with the eight to suggest a spade entry. West obediently shifted to a low spade that East won with the queen. Next, he lead a club for West to ruff and then regained the lead with another spade. A second club ruff followed and West ended the bloodbath by cashing the ace of diamonds. Most pairs ended up playing in heart and spade partials with varying results. For this E/W pair, defeating the contract two tricks for a score of +200 earned most of the matchpoints. Of course, there was one E/W pair who reached the cold contract of 4S for +620. I don't even want to guess how their auction went.

There are a couple of points of interest. First, the lead of an unsupported (no king) ace is not a popular lead so East suspected it was a singleton. Next, by gambling to win the first spade with the queen, East was able to regain the lead and give his partner a second club ruff.

The three primary signaling methods for the defense are attitude, count, and suit preference. The first two are used on every hand and it's surprising how often suit preference opportunities arise. Take a look at this one.

BIDDING: South had a routine weak two bid and North raised to game. This raise is fine with partnerships who employ sound weak two openers, but if your partner is less structured, the North hand should only make a game try.

PLAY: West had no attractive opening lead and finally decided to lead the ace of spades to look at dummy. He saw it might be necessary to switch to a club or a diamond before declarer could establish dummy's heart suit, but which suit should he lead? After some thought he concluded it unlikely the weak two bidder held both club honors so he switched to a club. Declarer won with dummy's jack and it was now easy to draw the remaining trumps and establish a heart honor for a diamond discard. A diamond shift at trick two would have resulted in down one, with declarer losing a trick in each suit.

The chance to succeed was missed at trick one. East should have played the nine of spades to indicate interest in the diamond suit. With club strength, the deuce of spades would be correct. This type of suit preference situation occurs on almost every hand. When partner knows (or it doesn't matter) how many cards you hold in a suit, the card you play in that suit should tell partner where your strength is. The two suits in question are usually obvious. Sometimes there is your partner's suit, declarer's suit and two others. Or, there may be declarer's suit, a danger suit, and two others. It is those "other" suits that you use your carding to give information to your partner.

As a defender it is important to place the opponents' high cards. Here East knew he could not count on his partner for help so he defended accordingly. Take the East chair and plan your defense.

BIDDING: East had a nice hand but when the auction reached him, he realized bidding would be very dangerous. South, holding a maximum 1NT opener, accepted his partner's invitation to game.

PLAY: Holding such a weak hand, perhaps West should have led a short suit in an attempt to find his partner's strength, but he finally selected the ten of hearts. Declarer won the heart and immediately took the diamond finesse. East won the king and realized if South held the 16-17 points his 3NT promised, West was broke. But, East saw a way to beat the hand...he led a low spade. Declarer won the king in dummy and led a low club. East jumped up with the ace and cashed four more spades to beat the contract by two tricks. This was a team game and at the other table, after winning the king of diamonds, East led a low club hoping to find his partner with an honor. That South easily made his contract with three hearts, four diamonds, and two clubs.

If declarer held four spades including the jack this defense would not have worked, but East took the best chance he had. Note that East must win the first club or declarer would have nine tricks. Defense is sometimes difficult but in this hand, all East had to do was some simple math.

As much fun as it is to take a successful finesse, it feels even better when you avoid a losing one. Take a look at this example.

BIDDING: Many people would not open the South hand but today's style is to bid aggressively. The 2NT bid was a forcing spade raise and South tried to slow his partner down by showing a minimum hand with his leap to 4S. But, North wasn't to be stopped and used Blackwood to bid the slam.

PLAY: West led the king of diamonds and declarer saw a diamond loser plus a possible loser in the club suit. Rather than rely on a 50% club finesse, South saw a play that would ensure the contract. He won the ace of diamonds and played a heart to his ace followed by a heart ruff in dummy. Then a spade to his hand to draw the trumps and another heart ruff in dummy. A second spade to his hand allowed him to ruff his last heart in dummy. Now he led a diamond and West was end played. His choices were to lead a club away from his king or give a ruff and a sluff allowing declarer to discard his club loser.

This simple elimination play was missed by many of the declarers. Most weren't in slam but overtricks are important in pairs events and making only five was a poor result.




