Some players merely count their high card points at their turn to bid while others look more closely at the entire hand. The following is a good example of proper hand evaluation along with a little card placement.

BIDDING: South passed his partner's first overcall but came to life after hearing the jump rebid. He visualized his partner holding a six or seven card diamond suit with outside strength. South's club cards looked strong enough so he ventured 3NT.

PLAY: West led a low a club won by dummy's jack. South now had nine tricks but since this was a pair's event, he looked around for an overtrick. From the auction, declarer realized West surely held the ace of spades so declarer led a diamond to his king followed by a low spade to dummy's king. He now had ten tricks and a very good result. Most of the other South players passed 3D because they "only had six points". A few were bold enough to bid 3NT but quickly ran their nine tricks. The important point is that South needs to recognize the value of his diamond king.

West's best opening lead is the king of hearts. Assuming declarer ducks, West must continue with the heart queen to avoid blocking the suit. Of course, East must cooperate by encouraging at trick one. This defense will leave declarer with only eight tricks.

There is no doubt that it takes skill to be successful at bridge but it also helps to have a little luck. Take a look and see if this was well played or just lucky.

***Roman Keycard Blackwood**

BIDDING: I was sitting North and almost just bid slam after my partner's 3H bid. However, we had the tools so stay out of slam if his heart suit was less than robust. My 4NT call was Keycard Blackwood which counts the king of the agreed suit as an ace. His 5C response showed one keycard so I became a bit nervous. My 5D bid asked if he held the queen of hearts and his response denied it. Since we were missing either the AQ or the KQ of hearts, I was now worried. I knew slam was still possible, but decided the odds were against us.

PLAY: West led the jack of clubs and partner counted four possible losers: 2 hearts, 1 diamond, and 1 club. He won the ace of clubs and played three rounds of spades pitching a club. Finding a 3-3 spade break was only a 36% proposition but this time it worked. Next he led the jack of hearts from dummy, East played the queen, and the king won as West showed out. A second heart went to the ten and ace. East switched to the diamond king won in dummy. My partner then played a good spade from dummy that East ruffed and South over-ruffed. Now declarer played the deuce of hearts to dummy's trey and discarded his diamond loser on a good spade and had 12 tricks. I knew I should have bid the slam!

Note the importance of keeping the heart deuce for later transportation to dummy. If East plays a the ace of heart instead of the queen, the same end game develops. So was this a lucky hand or was it my partner's skill? Well, a heart contract was played at 11 other tables and no one else made 12 tricks so I have to go with skill on this one.

If you're going to sacrifice, it usually pays to do it early. This hand is a good example.

BIDDING: The auction started calmly enough but then North leaped to 5H. He saw the favorable vulnerability and wanted to make E-W guess at the five level. Sure enough, East held such a good hand he took the plunge. South thought about doubling but it wasn't certain they could beat the small slam.

PLAY: North led a heart and the contract was soon down one. West can discard a diamond on the fourth spade and another on dummy's heart honor. It takes a diamond lead to beat it two tricks. North's bid paid off because if East doubles instead of bidding the slam, N-S are only down two for -300. That beats all of the E-W pairs who bid and make 5C.

If North had only bid 4H, East still might have bid six but would probably stop at five. When you're going to preempt, make the opponents' guess at the highest level you're willing to bid and do it immediately.

There's no doubt that some amount of good luck is necessary to turn an average session into a great one. Here's a hand where a lot of luck was needed.

BIDDING: Our team was behind when this hand arrived at our table. Sitting South, I opened a routine 1NT and accepted my partner's invitation to game. When dummy hit I was shocked and wondered how just far behind my partner thought we were.

PLAY: West led a low heart to East's ace and I won the continuation with the king. A lot of cards had to be right for this contract to make so I took a deep breath and led the queen of clubs. East won the king and just when I expected to see another heart, a low spade landed on the table. My first stroke of luck; apparently the hearts were divided 6-2. Since I would always go down if the spade ace was on my left, I rose with the king and won the trick. That was my second piece of good luck. I ran the clubs and eventually led a diamond to my jack which won and I had nine tricks.

Our opponents stopped in a club partial so this was a 10 IMP gain. It was a fun hand but I'm afraid it will only serve to encourage my partner.

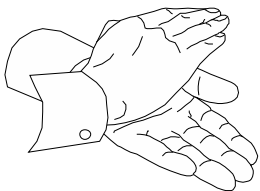

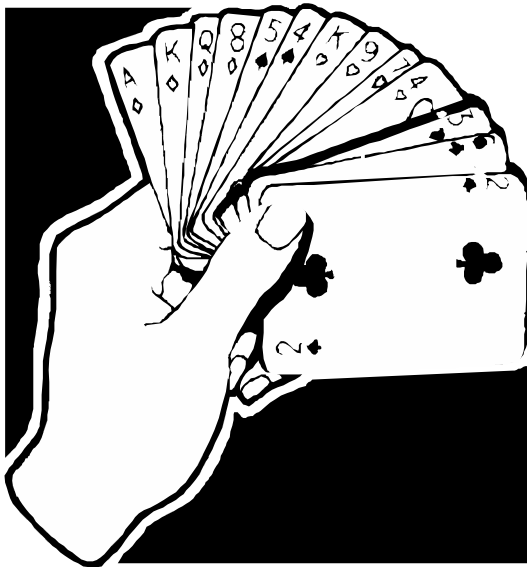
