Holding length in declarer's trump suit is usually a strong asset for the defense. But, it's important to keep control of that suit until releasing it can work to your advantage. Take a look.

**BIDDING:** South had a good hand and thought game was likely partner's two-level response. After opener's rebid in diamonds, North took a preference to hearts. Realizing his partner would probably have bid notrump with a spade honor, South jumped to game in hearts.

PLAY: The bidding begged for a spade lead and West obliged. Declarer ruffed the third spade followed by a diamond to dummy in order to lead the jack of hearts. This won the trick when West ducked. However, West won the next heart and led a fourth spade and South had no answer. Since he had lost three tricks, he ruffed the spade but West's fourth trump was the setting trick. Note if West wins the first heart, a spade continuation could be ruffed in dummy and declarer would succeed.

Perhaps more delicate bidding could have found the cold 5C contract.

#### #2

A strong declarer will look at all of his options before falling back on a finesse. This hand shows the finesse to be the third best solution.

BIDDING: This partnership uses a 2/1 game force system. The bidding was natural until South's jump in hearts to show 4+ card diamond support along with heart shortness. This also told North that South held more than five spades. With only five spades, South would have bid his diamond suit at the two-level rather than rebidding spades. Once South heard the spade support, he used Roman Keycard Blackwood to find two aces plus the spade queen in his partner's hand.

PLAY: West led his top two hearts with declarer ruffing the second one. South could discard one diamond on the ace of clubs and decided to see if the club suit divided 4-3 to provide a home for his other losing diamond. At trick three he unblocked the club king followed by a spade to dummy. Next he ruffed a club in his hand. Another spade to dummy allowed him to play the ace of clubs and discard a diamond. The 5-2 club break was bad news but he could always fall back on the diamond finesse. A closer look soon told him the finesse was unnecessary. He came to his hand with the king of diamonds and ran the rest of his trumps. On the last trump, he discarded dummy's club jack and came down to the AJ of diamonds. He next led a diamond toward dummy and when West followed with the diamond ten, declarer knew West's other card was the club queen. So declarer went up with diamond ace and smiled when the queen dropped on his right.

This "showup squeeze" occurs quite often. It's surprising how many hands can be made simply by playing the rest of your trumps. Too many players would simply take the losing diamond finesse after discovering the bad club break.

#3

The strong declarer has learned to pay close attention to every card played. That ability, combined with a recall of the auction, allowed this declarer to succeed in a marginal contract. Take a look.

BIDDING: Each player bid aggressively. At the end, South feared E/W could make 3S and he hoped to go down only one trick in 4H.

PLAY: West led ace and a second spade to East's king. East exited with ace and another heart. Declarer won, drew the last trump, and stopped to analyze the hand. He realized West probably held both minor suit queens for his overcall but it was the club queen that concerned him. Knowing from the auction West held only five spades and from the play so far only one heart, it was possible but unlikely the queen of clubs was alone or doubleton in West's hand. With no attractive alternative, declarer played a low club to dummy's ace and noticed the nine from East. Another possibility now presented itself: East might hold the 109 doubleton of clubs. Declarer came back to his hand with the diamond ace to lead the jack of clubs from his hand. West covered and declarer was delighted to see the ten from East. It was now routine to ruff a club to his hand and take the diamond finesse through West and claim ten tricks.

#### #4

As a defender, it's usually not wise to inform declarer you have a surprise for him. Here is a hand where defeat was almost certain until the defense opened its mouth.

BIDDING: North held a minimum hand but one most people open these days. South liked his hand much better after his partner raised and bid the slam. (The Blackwood convention was unnecessary since South knew two aces weren't missing but some players seem to use it for all slams.) West couldn't stand it and doubled hoping to score two trump tricks. This was a mistake.


PLAY: West made the bold lead of a club. Declarer realized West had no double without a trump stack so at trick two he led the ten of hearts. When this won the trick it was a simple matter of leading another toward the queen. West won the king and tried to cash a club but declarer ruffed and led a third heart to dummy's queen. A diamond back to his hand (safer than a spade) allowed declarer to draw the last trump. He then discarded his diamond losers on the long spade suit.

Without the double to guide him, declarer would probably start with the ace of hearts from his hand and consequently lose two heart tricks. West should have realized the difference between +50 and +100 was not enough to allow the slam to succeed. Greed is a terrible thing.




