Defense can be difficult but sometimes you just need a little imagination. Here is a hand where a defender took a chance and caught a careless declarer.

BIDDING: North's cue bid of the opponents' suit asked his partner about the strength of his overcall. South rebid 2NT to show extras and North bid the game.

PLAY: West led the jack of clubs and declarer counted his possible losers finding one too many: 1 heart, 1 diamond, and 2 clubs. From the auction, declarer placed East with king of clubs so he played low from dummy and won the ace in his hand. Next, he drew trumps followed by the queen of diamonds. After winning the king of diamonds, East saw he had to get his partner in the lead for another club through dummy. With little hesitation, this wily defender switched to a low heart. Playing too quickly, South put in the ten and was disappointed when West won with the jack and returned another club. The defense quickly wrapped up four tricks and left South to explain to his partner as well as his teammates from the other table why he failed to play the queen of hearts.

There were three reasons to play the queen instead of the ten: 1) East probably needed both the ace and king of hearts for his opening bid; 2) if West regained the lead, declarer would be defeated; and 3) he had no valid reason to not play the queen. Declarer's plan was to discard one heart on dummy's diamond suit and ruff another in dummy so the queen of hearts had no value. Give credit to East for finding the only way to defeat the hand.

Here is a hand where it all came down to the opening lead. Of course, one of the defenders helped a bit with that decision. Take a look.

BIDDING: After West's preempt, North showed his strength with a takeout double. Expecting the club ace to be on his right, East made a lead-directing club bid. South saw that all of his cards should be working so he entered the auction and North could not resist bidding the slam.

PLAY: West led the deuce of clubs and the slam could no longer be made. Note that without a club lead, declarer could draw trumps, cash the ace of hearts, and then lead a low heart toward his jack. East could win the queen and shift to a club but it would be too late. Declarer would win the club ace, unblock the jack of hearts, and ruff a diamond to dummy. He could then discard his club loser on the king of hearts.

Here's a hand where declarer saw a sure line of play that most of the other declarers missed. Take a look.

BIDDING: North's jump raise was invitational showing 10-12 support points with at least four hearts. South considered his hand a minimum and was unwilling to bid game. As you will see, North's queen of spades turned out to be a wasted value and passing was the right decision.

PLAY: West started with the jack of spades and declarer did not like his chances. Besides needing to find the jack of hearts, he had the heart ace to lose along with two possible tricks in each minor suit. The jack of diamonds in dummy gave him some hope so he won the spade in his hand to lead a low heart. Declarer was delighted that West had to win the ace of hearts, solving the trump problem. West continued with another spade which declarer won in dummy and drew the last two trumps. With trumps and spades eliminated, declarer now simply played ace and another club. The defenders could win this trick and cash another club but then they had to switch to diamonds or present declarer with a ruff/sluff. At the table, East won the club ten, cashed the king, and then played a small diamond which declarer ducked to West. Now the forced diamond return allowed South to make his contract, losing one heart, one diamond, and two clubs. Elimination plays such as this are common but often overlooked.

As always, remembering the auction can help you place the opponents' high cards. This declarer discovered everything she needed before making her final decision.

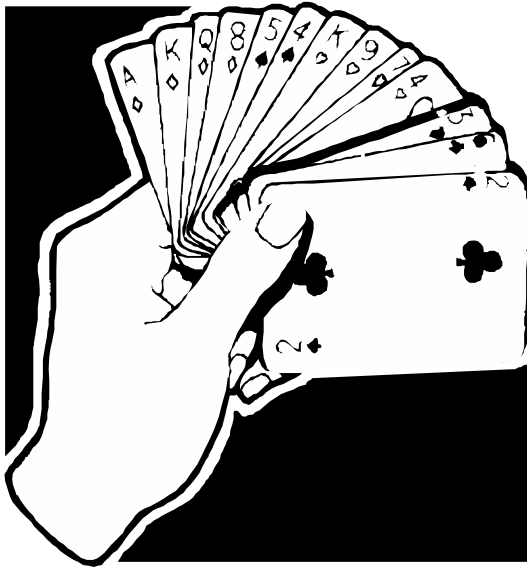

BIDDING: The auction was standard until North made a takeout double. It worked fine here but perhaps not if South's suit had been diamonds. It might have been better to pass expecting South to re-open with a takeout double.

PLAY: West led a low spade and declarer quickly saw she must lose two spades and two diamonds. This meant she must find the queen of clubs to make her contract. East won the spade ace and returned a low one to West's king. Making declarer's work easier, West next shifted to a low diamond. Again East won the ace and returned a small diamond to West's king. Now the defense switched to a trump and declarer stopped to consider what she had learned. Since East held the ace and queen of spades along with the diamond ace, he needed the club queen for his opening bid. Therefore, after drawing trumps, declarer finessed East for the club queen and made her contract. It may have seemed obvious to expect opener to hold the queen but if declarer could have placed East with the AQ of spades along with the AK of diamonds, playing West for the club queen would have been better.

The reason declarer could place the queen of spades in the East hand is that West would not have underled the king and queen of spades at trick one. The defenders earned demerits here for freely furnishing so much information but a long side suit in dummy will often cause opponents to quickly cash their winners. If the defense had been passive, say leading trumps at every opportunity, declarer should attack spades and diamonds before deciding clubs.

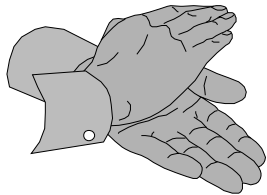

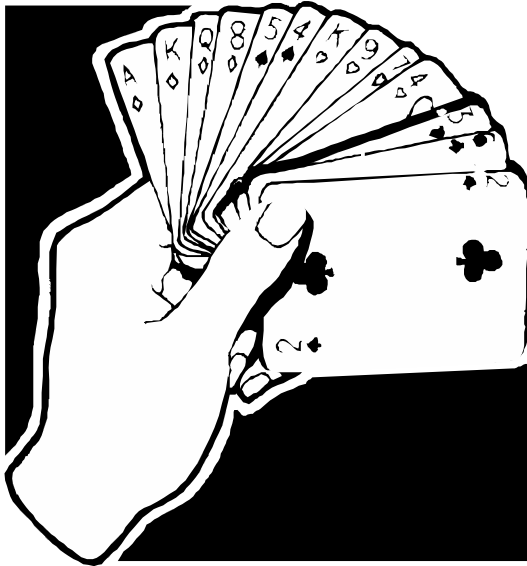
