Can you always believe your opponents? Well, the answer to that is easy but sometimes you do need to believe their bidding. Here is a hand that makes that point.

BIDDING: North opened his minimum hand, East made a takeout double, and South showed his good spade suit. After North rebid 1NT, South bid the spade game. This was a team event and he did not want to miss a vulnerable game.

PLAY: West led a club to his partner's ace and South won the club continuation with his king. Declarer saw he could ruff his last club and discard two diamonds on the heart suit, but that still left him with a diamond and a spade to lose. Clearly this meant he could not afford to lose a second spade trick. East's takeout double strongly suggested three and very likely four spades so declarer decided to play him for the jack. At trick three declarer ruffed his last club in dummy followed by a low spade. Declarer's ten won the trick as West showed out. It was now easy to go to dummy with a diamond, discard two diamonds on dummy's top hearts, and lead another spade. It didn't matter if East ducked or won the ace, declarer had held his losers to one spade, one diamond, and one club.

It's true declarer might have lost a spade to a singleton jack in the West hand but he went with the odds. The auction said that East held three or four of the outstanding spade cards and those are pretty good odds. When in doubt, trust your math.

Here is a hand that challenged both the defenders and declarer. Look at the hand and decide if you want to defend or declare.

BIDDING: After South opened the bidding, sitting in the West chair I could either overcall a bold 1NT or make a takeout double. Holding four hearts I decided the double was the better and safer call. North redoubled anxious to defend if I ran to hearts or clubs. Fortunately for me, South was determined to show his second suit and I was left unpunished.

PLAY: From the auction, I knew declarer would probably need to ruff diamonds in dummy so I started with three rounds of trumps. The first defensive problem was for my partner to find a discard on the third spade. She knew better than to throw away a club so that left a heart or a diamond. Four small diamonds might seem unimportant but she remembered the bidding and finally discarded a low heart. After winning the third trick in his hand, declarer led his only heart. I realized that playing the ace would allow declarer to establish the heart suit so I played low. Now declarer could discard one small diamond on the good club but that still left him with two diamond losers. But, declarer wasn't done. He took the losing diamond finesse and won the diamond return. Next he ran the rest of his trumps and caught my partner in a diamond-club squeeze. In the four-card ending, partner couldn't keep the eight of diamonds and four clubs. We gave it a good try but declarer was the winner.

Note if East discards a diamond declarer will have an easy ten tricks. The same is true if I win my ace of hearts. As for the bidding, if South hadn't bid diamonds I had no safe place to run and would probably end up -800 or -1100.

If you bid aggressively, your declarer play must be up to the task. Here is a hand that challenged the declarer.

BIDDING: At this vulnerability the N/S partnership uses sound weak-two bids so North raised to game. It seems too optimistic for me but it's difficult to argue with success.

PLAY: West led the ace of clubs and then shifted to a low heart. Declarer saw he must lose two clubs and at least one spade so he could not afford to lose a heart. It wouldn't work to next ruff a heart because he had no quick entry back to his hand. He could ruff one heart and try to discard the other on the third round of diamonds but a 3-3 diamond break offered only a 36% chance. He finally decided to lead a club and hope the defenders would switch to trumps. However, West won the club king and continued with another heart. Declarer ruffed this in dummy and then played the good queen of clubs from dummy. East was fixed: if he ruffed declarer would overruff, trump his other heart in dummy, and only lose one trump trick. If East failed to ruff, declarer would discard his losing heart, play the spade queen from dummy, and again lose only one spade trick.

Reaching the best contract is easier when you have the right tools. Take a look at a hand that swung a match.

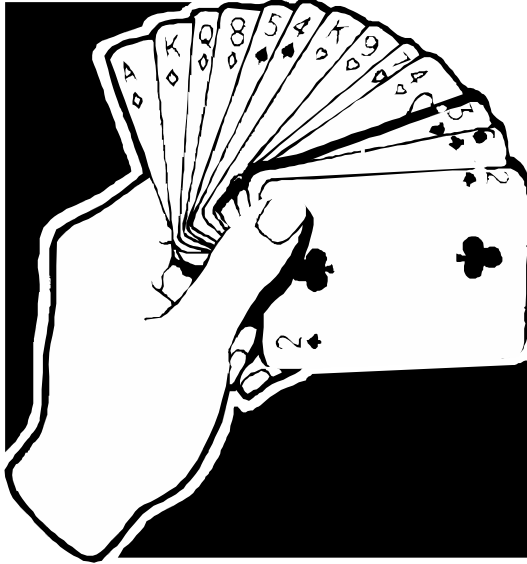
*Responsive double

BIDDING: In a local Swiss Team event, the first three bids were the same at both tables. Next, my partner in the North seat made a responsive double showing the other two suits and enough values to bid at the three level. I realized our club fit gave us a good chance for ten tricks and since my suit was so strong, I bid game in hearts. At the other table, North was stuck for a bid and eventually passed.

PLAY: West led ace and another spade and I quickly wrapped up eleven tricks losing only to the two black aces. (A diamond shift at trick two would prevent the overtrick.) Our teammates at the other table took nine tricks in their spade partial. The two scores of +450 and +140 meant 11 IMPs for our team and we went on to win the match.

The responsive double is a cousin to the negative double. The negative double is used over interference when your side opens the auction. The responsive double is available when an opponent opens in a suit and is raised by his partner. I recommend you research this convention and add it to your card.

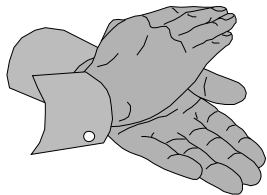

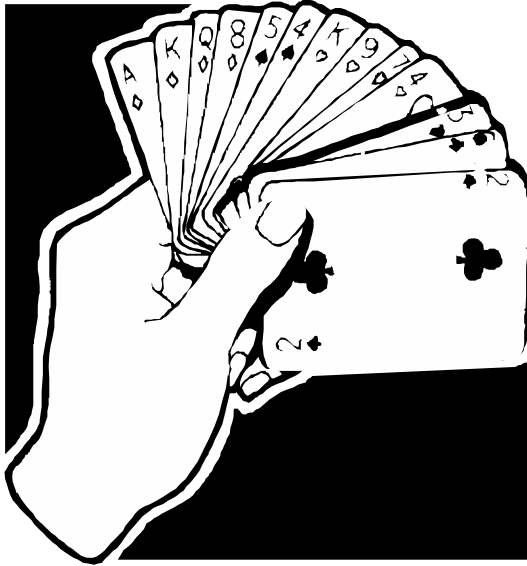
