When playing in a team event, it's usually right to be aggressive when bidding vulnerable games. But, in a pairs event with matchpoint scoring, a plus score should be your target. Here is a hand when many pairs didn't stop soon enough.

*New Minor Forcing

BIDDING: After North rebid 1NT to show a balanced 12-14 point hand, South's hand was good enough to invite game. His 2C bid was the New Minor Forcing convention used here to uncover a possible heart fit. North showed the fit but also indicated his hand was a minimum. Since South was inviting game, North would have jumped in hearts to show a better hand. That ended South's hope for game and he reluctantly passed.

PLAY: West led a spade and the defense had no trouble collecting 1 spade, 2 hearts, and 2 diamonds. What is interesting about this hand is that in a local game, +110 was worth ALL of the matchpoints. Every other pair reached either the three or four level and were defeated. Of course it's unlucky that the trump suit divided 4-1 but still you need to have the bidding tools that will allow you to stay out of marginal games at this form of scoring.

Partnerships with the right convention or agreement can sometimes reach a contract that others cannot. Here is a good hand to show how the Lebensohl convention can be very useful.

BIDDING: Holding a great hand, North made a takeout double of West's weak-two bid. South responded with his best suit and North had to consider his next bid. Did South have zero points or perhaps eight or nine? Fortunately this partnership uses lebensohl responses to a t/o double of a weak-two bid and didn't have to guess. South's response showed 7-10 points and a club suit. With a weaker hand, South would make an artificial bid of 2NT asking North to bid 3C. South could then pass or sign off in diamonds or hearts. Knowing South had values, North next cue bid asking his partner to bid 3NT with a spade stopper.

PLAY: West led the queen of spades hoping his partner had an entry and could return a spade. Declarer won the king and counted eight tricks: one spade, five diamonds, and two clubs. Realizing he couldn't safely establish a heart trick, his only chance was to find the queen of clubs. So at trick two he led a low club to dummy's ace followed by a low club back toward his hand. It was decision time and declarer thought since West's spade bid promised a six-card suit, there was much more "room" in the East hand. Going with those odds, instead of playing for the clubs to divide 2-2, declarer put in the jack and was delighted to see West discard. Declarer now had eleven tricks and a fine score of +660.

Note that those pairs who bid game in clubs had the same guess in the trump suit but if they were successful, their score would only be +600.

This hand was very painful for declarer. He and his partner reached the ideal contract but his card play let him down. Take a look at an accident that should have been avoided.

BIDDING: North's 2D bid was game forcing and South had an easy raise. North then showed his support for hearts and South followed with a club cue bid. Next Blackwood was used to discover South held three aces and confident he could count thirteen tricks, North bid the grand slam.

PLAY: West led a trump and declarer saw he did indeed have thirteen tricks: one spade, one spade ruff, five hearts, five diamonds, and one club. He quickly won the ace of spades, ruffed a spade in dummy, and drew trumps in three rounds. He then led the FOUR of diamond to dummy blocking the suit. He squirmed a bit but finally had to concede a club.

Playing too quickly is often costly. After counting his tricks, declarer should have looked around for possible problems and the potential blocking of the diamond suit could have been spotted. Obviously, declarer has no trouble if he plays his ten, nine, and eight of diamonds under dummy's three honors.

Some hands offer many different chances to succeed. Here is a beauty where declarer played very carefully to bring in his slam.

BIDDING: Holding a singleton diamond, South's bid won't be to everyone's taste but he did have 21 high card points. North did the math, added a point for his 5th diamond, and confidently raised to six.

PLAY: West led the ten of spades and declarer stopped to count his tricks: 4 spades, 1 heart, 3 diamonds, and 2 clubs. Additional tricks could come from a successful heart finesse, the diamond jack dropping, or a 3-2 club break. He had few entries to dummy so he had to be very careful as he attempted to find the two extra tricks. First he won the spade lead in his hand. Next he cashed the diamond king followed by king and a low club won by West's jack. Declarer now had eleven tricks. The spade continuation was won in dummy followed by the ace and queen of diamonds. When the jack did not drop, declarer led a low heart, closed his eyes, and played the queen from his hand. That was twelve tricks and ten IMPs when the opposing team failed to bid the slam.

There are several lessons here. First, slow down and count your tricks. Playing too quickly to trick one is a frequent mistake. Next, make sure you use your entries in the correct order. And finally, it's usually best to exhaust all other options before resorting to a finesse.

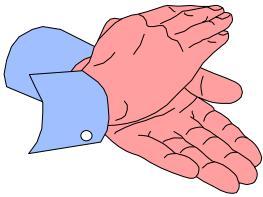

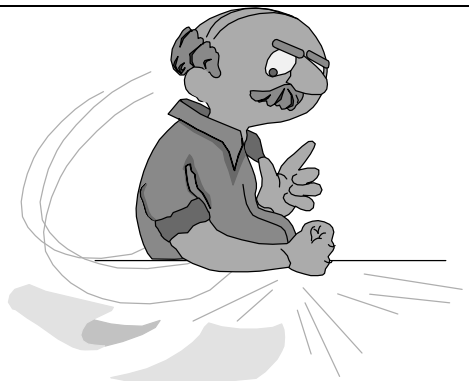

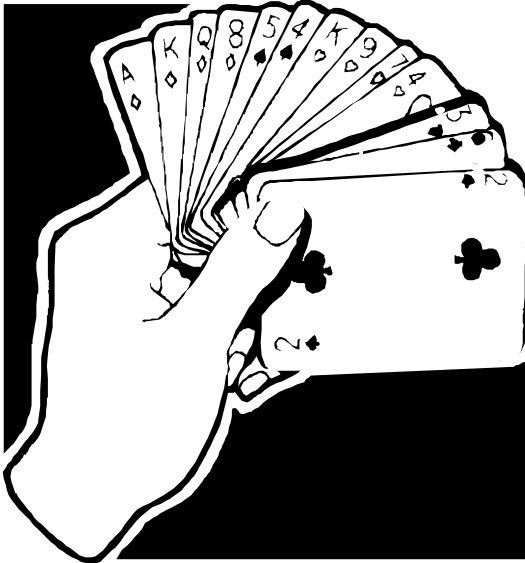
