Most pairs events involve very competitive auctions. Sometimes it's hard to know when to stop or bid one more. In this hand, it looked like the defense was going to prevail but they ran up against the wrong declarer.

BIDDING: It started with a simple one-level opening bid but quickly escalated. West made a weak jump overcall and North liked his hand enough to jump to game. East got into the act by competing to the five level and South passed the buck back to North. His pass said he was uncertain whether to double or bid one more. North made the final decision.

PLAY: West led the ace of diamonds and when East followed with the ten suggesting a shift to hearts, did just that. Declarer was wishing he had doubled the opponents because he was looking at three losers: 2 hearts and 1 diamond). He did see a glimmer of hope; if East was long in hearts and clubs, he might be squeezed. However, that meant losing a heart now to rectify the count. He played small on the first heart and won the second as West hi-lowed. Next, South drew trumps ruffing his two diamond losers along the way. Now he played off the rest of his trumps and came down to a three-card ending with East yet to discard. Dummy held the A103 of clubs while declarer held the 7 of hearts and the K5 of clubs. Poor East was doomed; he had to discard from the jack of hearts and the Q98 of clubs and South had eleven tricks.

Note the squeeze would not work without the heart duck. Also notice the squeeze could be broken up if West shifted to a club at trick two. Now if declarer ducks a heart to set up the squeeze, a second club foils the plan. Nobody said defense was easy.

I watched the following hand on the computer and thought North liked his hand way too much. However, his aggressive bidding was rewarded by his partner's declarer play. Take a look at a three-suit repeating squeeze.

BIDDING: Opposite a 2NT opening bid, North used Puppet Stayman to find his partner with a five-card spade suit. Next, there were cue bids followed by North's jump to slam. Apparently this woke up West who decided he should double.

PLAY: West led the queen of diamonds and South could count eleven tricks: 5 spades, 3 hearts (assuming the doubler held the queen), 2 diamonds, and 1 club. Declarer won the diamond and promptly pulled trumps. Next, he led the jack of hearts covered by West. Two more hearts gave us this ending (East immaterial):

Now declarer executed the first squeeze by playing his last spade, pitching a diamond from dummy. With no good answer, West finally discarded the ten of diamonds hoping his partner held the nine. Now declarer played his two remaining diamonds and West was toast. The doubled slam with an overtrick was worth +1210 while the N/S pair at the other table stopped in game.

One of the most frequent mistakes made on defense is the automatic return of partner's opening lead. Here is a hand that shows it pays to stop and think.

BIDDING: North could have only invited but he decided to add a point for the five-card diamond suit and South was quickly in game.

PLAY: West led a low spade from his strongest suit. Declarer won with the ten in dummy as East followed low. With only eight tricks, declarer needed to find the diamond queen but his play of ace and a low one lost. East started to routinely return a spade but stopped to think more about the hand. It was clear South was still holding two (or more) spade honors for West would not have underled three honors. He also knew West had started with only four spades: he had led the four, the three was in dummy, and declarer had followed with the deuce at trick one. Still, West could hold the AQ over declarer's KJ so a spade might be right. Instead, East decided to cash the ace of hearts to get a reaction from West. That reaction was the encouraging ten. The defense soon took four hearts along with the diamond to defeat the contract. Note that a spade continuation allows declarer to claim ten tricks.

One of the most frequent mistakes made on defense is the automatic return of partner's opening lead. Here is another hand that demonstrates that point.

BIDDING: North-South used Stayman to search for a possible major suit contract. Failing at that, they bid the game in notrump.

PLAY: The auction warned West against a spade lead so he started with the jack of clubs. East encouraged with the seven as declarer won the queen. (Perhaps East should have played the king in case the opening lead was from AJ10x). Declarer won the first club followed by a low diamond to dummy's king. East ducked and declarer returned to his hand to lead another diamond. East won the ace and played the king of clubs. Declarer played low and West followed with the ten. This showed either an original three-card suit (J10x) or interest in a shift to spades. East decided it was the latter and put the spade eight (attitude) on the table. Declarer was forced to duck as West won the queen. West now continued clubs and declarer was doomed. West still had to win the diamond jack along with the two club tricks, the ace of diamonds, and the queen of spades.

Note that declarer erred by ducking the second club and giving the opponents a chance to shift to spades. East's play in the club suit was consistent with a holding of three cards.




