Playing with a new partner can be difficult. There are always so many things you need to discuss but don't think about until the game has begun. This hand was the first one in a session with a new partner.

BIDDING: I was North and after my partner opened the bidding I was thinking slam. We had some basic agreements but didn't get into much detail and this was our first hand. I used the Fourth Suit Forcing convention and when he rebid 2NT to show a minimum balanced hand, I wasn't sure how to continue. Finally, I just bid the small slam and hoped for the best. I'm not sure but I think at that point he might have wondered what he was in for the rest of the afternoon.

PLAY: West led a diamond and my partner had no trouble taking all of the tricks. He won the diamond, drew trumps, and set up dummy's heart suit. Since seven clubs was cold (and also seven hearts and seven notrump with the heart finesse), I felt perhaps I should have made a better effort of looking for the grand. However, most pairs had the same problem and stopped in a heart game, so our result was worth 33 of 38 matchpoints.

Many players did not open the South hand. My partner informed me that he opens all eleven point hands if he has at least 2 1/2 quick tricks. I filed that away for future auctions.

It only makes sense that you should have a goal or a purpose when you make a bid. You may want to declare, to preempt or impede the opponents, or make a lead directing call. However, that bid can come around and bite you if it was made for no reason.

BIDDING: I was South and reached game after my partner showed his spade suit by a transfer bid. After first passing, East entered the auction with an overcall that seemed to accomplish very little. As you will see, that little turned out to be a lot.

PLAY: West obediently led his partner's suit. East won the ace and then led a low diamond. Unless the diamonds were extremely cruel to me, I expected no trouble making the game so I started looking for those valuable overtricks. I won the ace of diamonds and drew two rounds of trumps in my hand. Next, I led the queen of clubs and pitched a heart from dummy when West played low. I then led a trump to dummy followed by the ten of diamonds. East discarded a club and West won the jack. I won the heart shift and claimed eleven tricks. I stated I would run the diamonds and discard dummy's last heart. I ended up with 5 spades, 1 heart, 4 diamonds, and 1 club.

In a local game, making five was the top result. Most N/S pairs had to settle for ten tricks after a heart lead.

Some players like to keep the bidding simple while others are real "scientists" who have many conventions and agreements on their convention cards. Here is a hand that took the scientists several rounds of bidding before the ultimate contract was found.

BIDDING: North's 2NT response was natural showing 13-15 high card points and a balanced hand that might contain three spades. South rebid his suit to show six and North cooperated by cue bidding diamonds to agree spades and show his cheapest ace. Holding a huge hand, South next used Roman Keycard Blackwood to discover how many keycards (4 aces + king of trump suit) his partner held. North acknowledged holding one and South next asked about the queen of trumps. South's heart bid showed the queen of spades along with the king of hearts. South was not done yet; his club bid asked about that suit. North bid the next step, 6D, which showed third around control, either a doubleton or the queen. South decided his partner would not have jumped to 2NT with a small doubleton club so he expected the queen. With all of this information, South could count thirteen tricks and bid the grand slam in notrump.

PLAY: West led a heart and South quickly claimed. Several pairs reached seven spades but few had the tools to reach the grand slam in notrump.

Bidding a grand slam with only twelve tricks in sight is usually not sound bridge but this declarer was up to the task.

BIDDING: South's 2NT opening bid showed 20-22 high card points so North was immediately interested in slam. He transferred to spades and then used Roman Keycard Blackwood (4 aces + trump king). South admitted to four keycards and when North next asked about kings, South showed the king of clubs. North could now count twelve tricks and was confident that his partner could find another so he bid the grand slam.

PLAY: Not wanting to give away a trick, West led a low trump. Declarer did indeed have only twelve tricks: 7 spades, 1 heart, 2 diamonds, and 2 clubs. Each suit but spades offered a finesse for the extra trick but declarer was reluctant to guess which finesse to choose so declarer decided to combine his chances. After winning the spade in his hand, he played a second round and then tempted West by leading the queen of hearts. West played low without a hitch so declarer won with dummy's ace. Next he drew the last trump followed by three rounds of clubs discarding the diamond jack on the second one and ruffing the third one in dummy. The queen did not appear so that left the diamond finesse or a squeeze. Still not wanting to rely on a finesse, he ran the rest of his trumps. When the last trump was played from dummy, here was the ending:

East had to keep the queen of clubs so he released a diamond. Declarer discarded his jack of clubs and now West was under the gun. He had to keep his king of hearts so he too discarded a diamond. The double squeeze worked and declarer's thirteenth trick was the nine of diamonds. Note the diamond threat needed to be in declarer's hand for the squeeze to work.

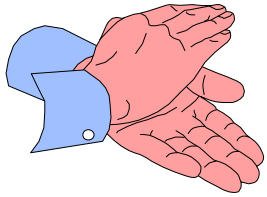

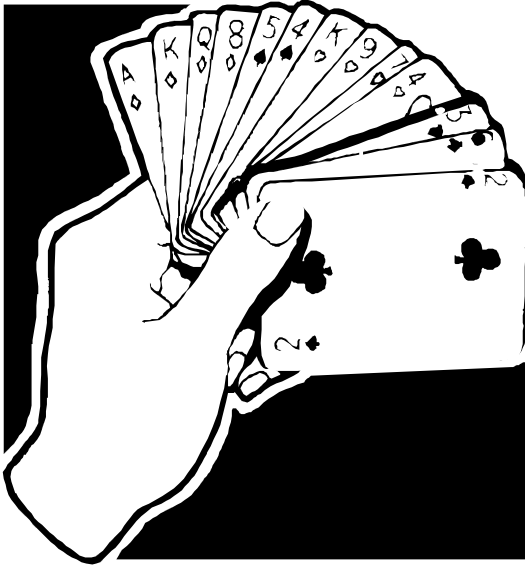
